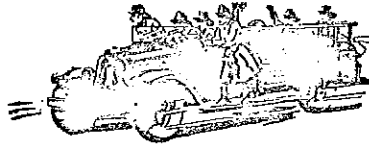

## TRAINING

Chief Don Schlensker and Captain Charles Meyer attended the Fire Department Instructor Conference in Memphis, Tennessee. This conference was attended by over 4,300 men from the United States and several foreign nations.

Captain Robert Weitzel and Deputy Chief Bob Eisenecker attended the Ohio State Fire School at Ohio State University. Captain Weitzel attended a course in heavy rescue. Deputy Chief Eisenecker attended a course in fire inspections. This is a five day course.

Seventeen firemen attended a 36 hour Basic Fire Service Training Program. This amounted to 612 hours of training.

Thirteen firemen attended a 30 hour Advance Fire Service Training Program. This program consists of actual fire fighting. This amounted to 390 hours of training.

A total of 3184 hours was accumulated by the firemen through weekly fire drills. Every fireman must attend one out of three drills. Our weekly drills cover all phases of fire fighting.

The members of the life squad contributed 969 hours of their time in weekly drills. The drills cover all phases of emergency first aid.

Outside Functions Attended by the Fire Department

Chief Schlensker attended four Ohio State Firemen's Association meetings in Columbus.

Chief Schlensker attended six Western Hamilton County Fire Protective Association meetings. Chief Schlensker is President of this organization.

Chief Schlensker attended four Hamilton County Fire Chief's Association meetings. Chief Schlensker was elected Vice President of this association.

Chief Schlensker and his wife attended the Ohio Fire Chief's Association Conference in Mansfield, Ohio.

Eight firemen and their wives attended the Ohio State Firemen's Association Conference in Toledo.

Thirty-six firemen took part in the Harvest Home Parade. The Ladies Auxiliary also marched in this parade.

Chief Schlensker and his wife along with Fireman Bill Dickman and his wife attended the International Association of Fire Chiefs Conference in Louisville, Kentucky.

Four pieces of equipment and 8 firemen took part in the Memorial Day Parade in the Monfort Heights area.

Mrs. Edith Dickman was elected President of the Ladies Auxiliary, Ohio State Firemen's Association.

## Fire Prevention Week

Fire prevention posters were distributed to all schools and business places in our area.

Fire drills were conducted in all schools in our district. The time of evacuation again this year was very satisfactory at all schools.

A fire drill was conducted during two services in one of our churches. This has been a practice two times a year for the past several years.

Our life squad participated in the demonstration at New Burlington. This was sponsored by the Western Hamilton County Fire Protective Association with seventeen departments participating.

Miss Barb Sabers was entered in the Miss Fire Prevention contest. She placed second in this contest.

One piece of equipment was entered in the Greater Cincinnati Fire Prevention Parade in the Mt. Washington area.



### Other Activities

Our firemen flushed and serviced all fire plugs in our area. The firemen also sprayed weed killer around all plugs where necessary.

A number of inspections and follow up visits were made by Deputy Chief Eisenecker and Fireman Rielage. The State Fire Marshal's office and the County Building Inspector's office were contacted for help when necessary.
