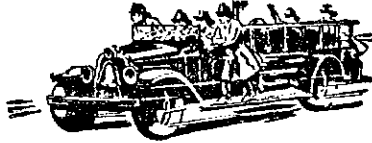

T R A I N I N G

Chief Don Schlensker, Ass't. Chief Charles Meyer, and Capt. Robert Weitzel attended the Fire Department Instructors Conference in Kansas City, Mo.. This conference is attended by over 4,000 men from the United States and several foreign nations.

Capt. Robert Sweeney attended the Ohio State Fire School at Ohio State University. Capt. Sweeney received instruction in emergency victim care. This is a five day school.

Capt. Robert Sweeney attended a 100 hour course on instructor training for emergency victim care. Capt. Sweeney is a state instructor, certified by the Ohio Department of Education for emergency victim care.

Capt. James Rutenschroer, Lieut. Rick Frey, and Squadman Tom Rielage attended the Ohio First Aid and Rescue Association Conference in Columbus. This was a three day conference,

Eleven firefighters attended a 36 hour basic fire service training program. This totaled 396 hours of training.

Twenty six firefighters attended a 30 hour advanced fire service training program. this amounted to 780 hours of training.

A total of 8402 hours were accumulated by the firemen through weekly fire drills. Every firefighter must attend one out of three drills. These drills cover all phases of fire fighting.

The members of the life squad contributed 1408 hours of their time in weekly drills. These drills cover all phases of emergency victim care and first aid.

Chief Schlensker attended the Greater Cincinnati Arson Investigators Conference in Evendale. This is a two day course.

Eighteen firefighters attended a four hour course on poison gases at Cheviot.

OUTSIDE FUNCTIONS ATTENDED BY THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

Chief Schlensker attended four Ohio State Firemen's Association meetings in Columbus, Ohio.

Several members attended six Western Hamilton County Fire Protective Association meetings.

Chief Schlensker attended six meetings of the Hamilton County Fire Chief's Association. Chief Schlensker is Vice-President of this association.

Chief Schlensker and his wife attended the Ohio Fire Chief's Conference in Toledo, Ohio.

Ten firemen and their wives attended the Ohio State Firemen's Association Conference in Cincinnati. Chief Schlensker was elected Second Vice-President of this association.

Fourty five firemen and the Ladies Auxiliary, along with four pieces of equipment, participated in the Harvest Home Parade.

Three pieces of equipment and several firemen participated in the Memorial Day Parade in Monfort Heights.

One piece of equipment and three firemen participated in the Memorial Day Parade in Cheviot.

Chief Schlensker and his wife attended the International Fire Chief's Association Conference in St. Louis, Mo..

Capt. Robert Weitzel and several firemen attended eleven training officers meetings. Capt. Weitzel is president of this association.

The fire department cooperated in the Firemens Mile of Dime Campaign.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

Fire prevention posters were distributed to all school and business places in our area.

Fire drills were conducted in all schools in our area. The time of evacuation was very satisfactory at all locations.

A fire drill was conducted during two services in one of our churches. This has been a practice of this church for the past several years.

Our department participated in the Greater Cincinnati Fire Prevention Week Parade in Milford.

Miss Vicki Bohl was the winner of our department Miss Flame Contest.

O T H E R A C T I V I T I E S

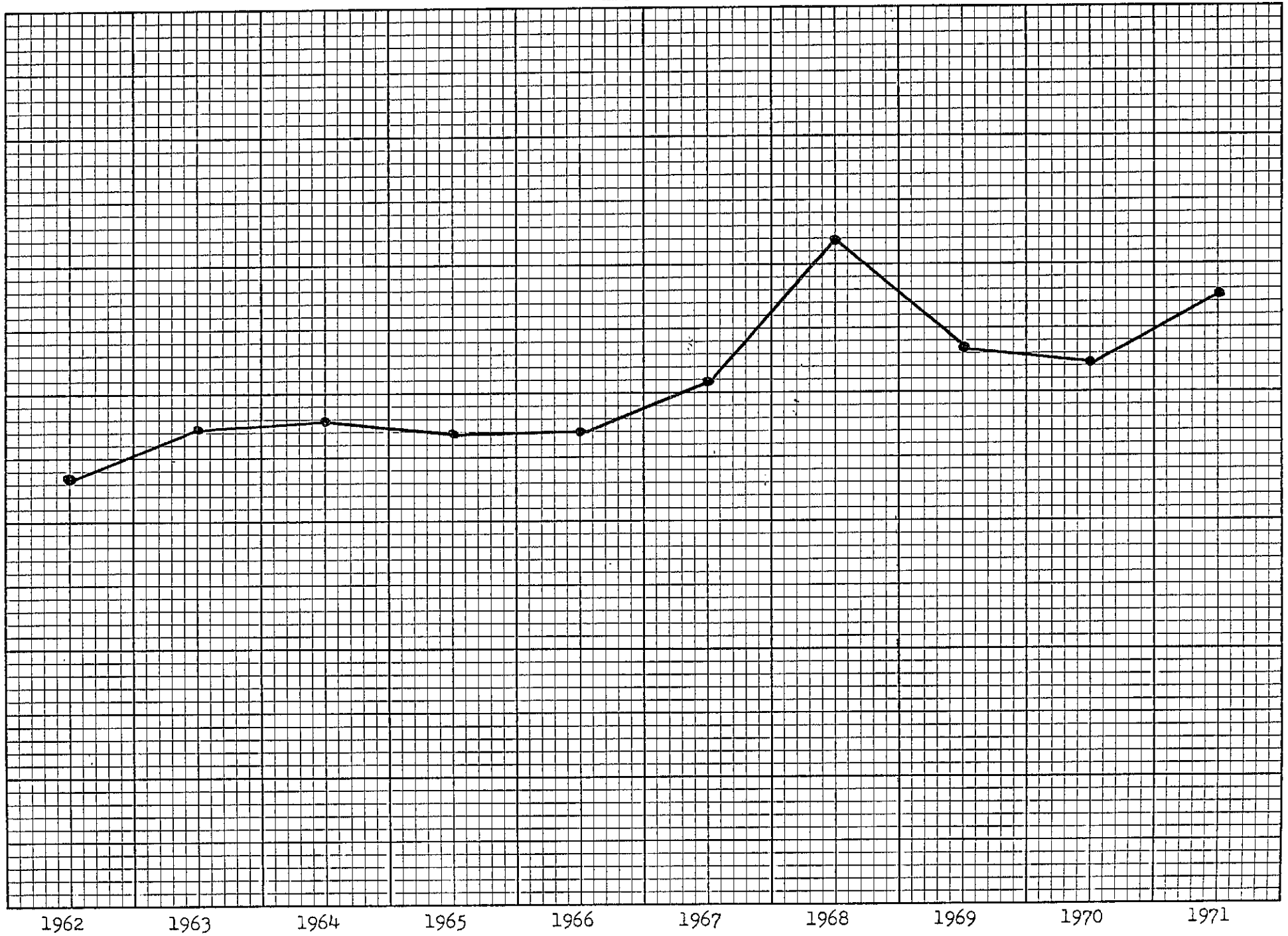

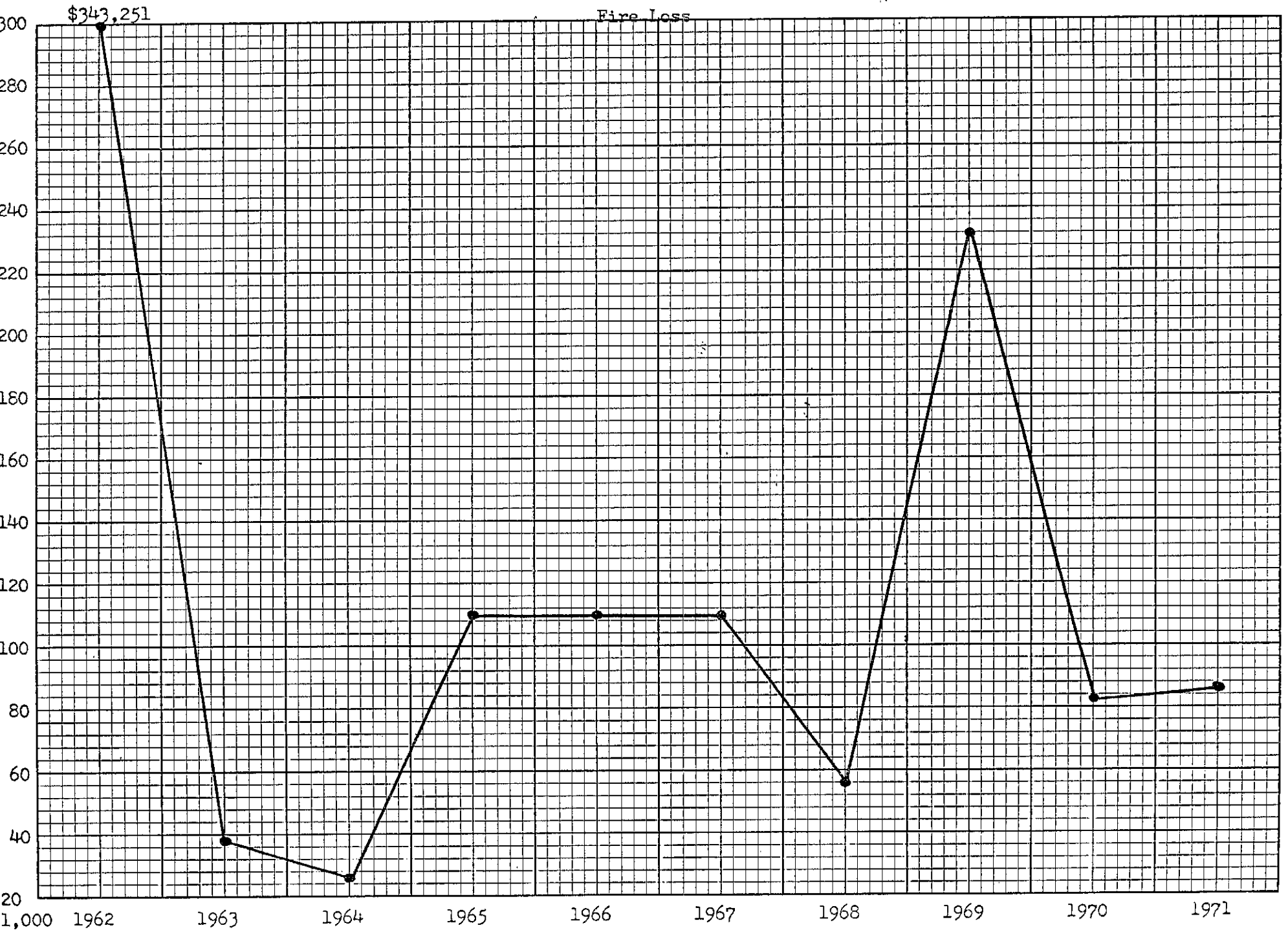
A baby sitter training course was conducted by the fire department. We have trained over 850 girls in this course.

Ass't. Charles Meyer conducted a 15 hour training course for one of our industrial plants. This was the first formal fire brigade in our area.



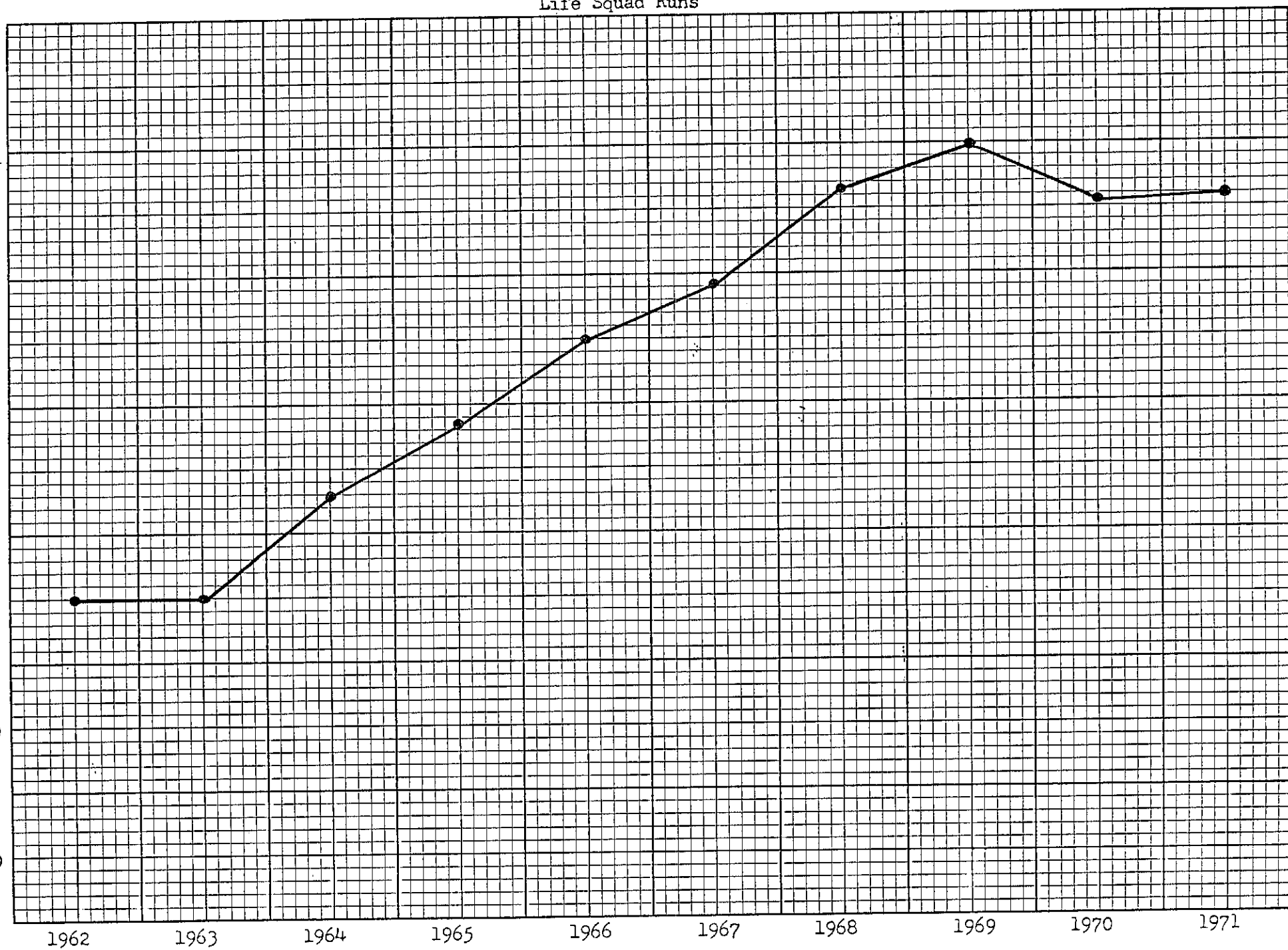
Fire Runs





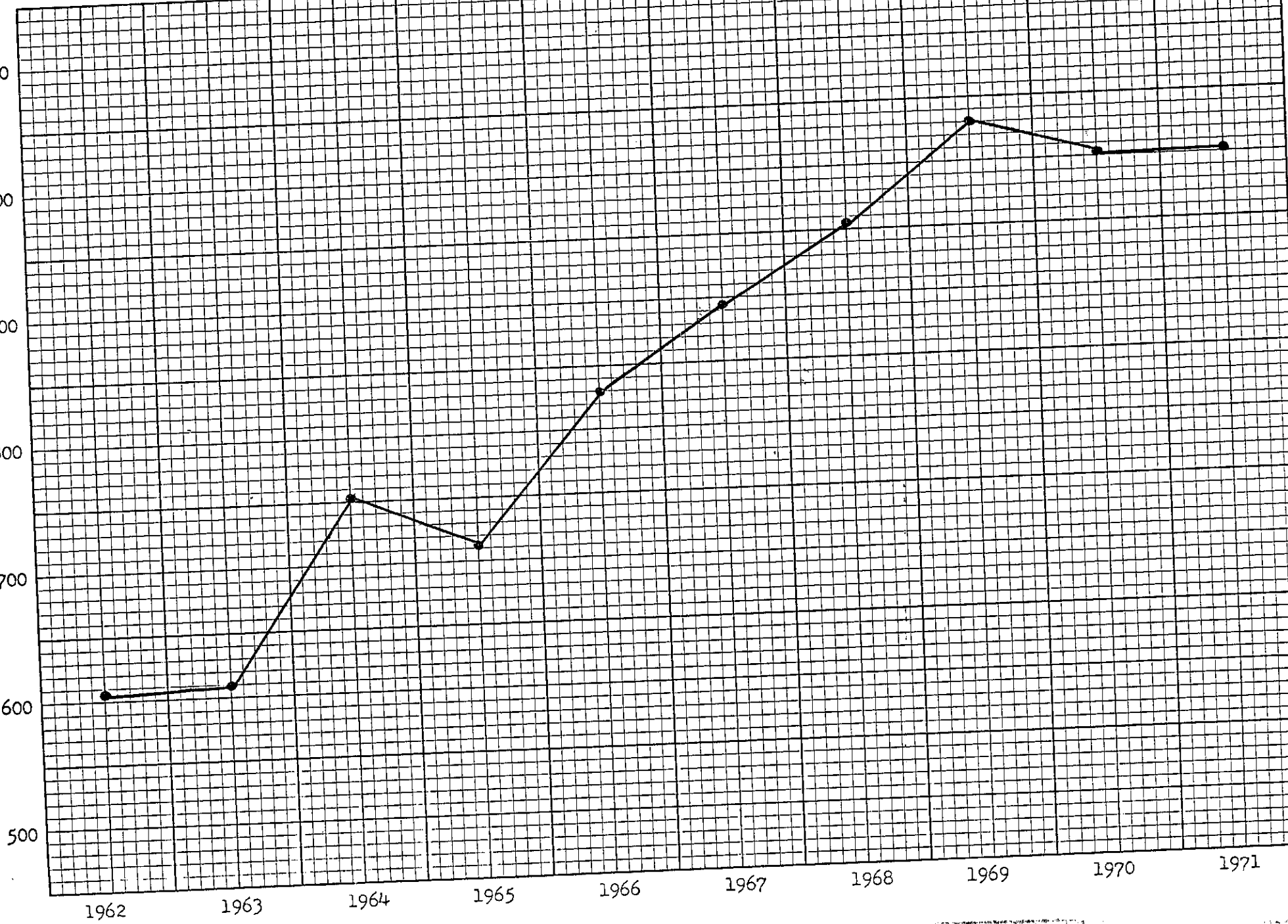


Life Squad Runs
