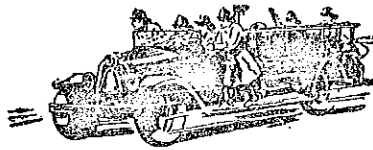

T R A I N I N G

Chief Don Schlänsker and Assistant Chief Charles Meyer attended the Fire Department Instructors Conference in Kansas City, Missouri. This conference is attended by over 4,000 men from the United States and several foreign nations.

Captain James Rutenschroer, Lieutenant Rick Frey and squadman Tom Rielage attended the Ohio First Aid and Rescue Association Conference in Columbus. This was a three day conference.

Fourteen firefighters attended a 36 hour basic fire service training program. This totaled 504 hours of training.

A total of 8,456 hours were accumulated by the fireman through weekly fire drills. Every firefighter must attend one out of three drills. These drills cover all phases of fire fighting.

The members of the life squad contributed 1,468 hours of their time in weekly drills. These drills cover all phases of emergency victim care and first aid.

Chief Schlänsker attended the Greater Cincinnati Arsen Investigators Conference in Evendale. This is a two day course.

Six squadmen attended a fourteen week course concerning emergency room care at St. Francis Hospital.

O T H E R A C T I V I T I E S

A number of inspections were conducted by Lieutenant Seng and Firefighter Fox along with other members of the fire department. The State Fire Marshalls office and the Hamilton County Building Inspection Office were contacted for help when necessary.

A baby sitter training course was conducted by the fire department. We have trained over 900 girls in this course.

OUTSIDE FUNCTIONS ATTENDED BY THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

Chief Schlensker attended four Ohio State Firemen's Association meetings in Columbus, Ohio.

Several members attended six Western Hamilton County Fire Protection Association meetings.

Chief Schlensker attended six meetings of the Hamilton County Fire Chiefs Association.

Chief Schlensker and his wife attended the Ohio Fire Chiefs Conference in Troy, Ohio.

Six firemen and their wives attended the Ohio State Firemen's Association Conference in Columbus, Ohio. Chief Schlensker is second vice-president of this association.

Thirty-five firemen and the Ladies Auxiliary, along with four pieces of equipment participated in the Harvest Home Parade.

One piece of equipment and three firemen participated in the Memorial Day Parade in Cheviot.

Captain Robert Weitzel and several officers attended eleven training officers meetings.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

Fire Prevention posters were distributed to all school and business places in our area.

Fire drills were conducted in all schools in our area. The time of evacuation was very satisfactory at all locations.

Our department participated in the Greater Cincinnati Fire Prevention Week Parade in North College Hill.

The fire department conducted demonstrations on four evenings during fire prevention week in the Monfort Heights and Mack area.

A dedication of the new addition of the Mack Station was held the last Sunday of Fire Prevention week.

Miss Janet Siemer was the winner of our Miss Flame Contest.

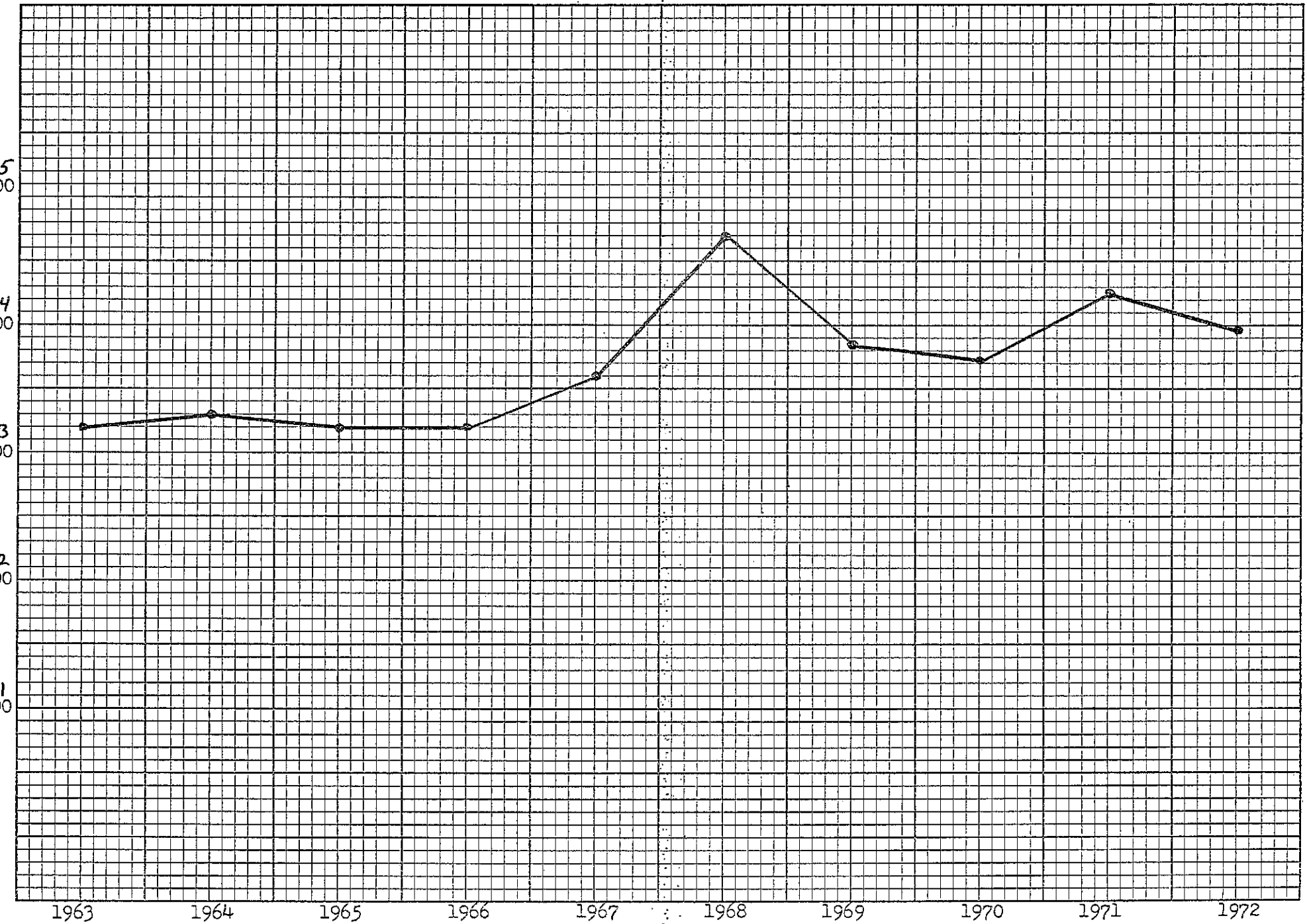

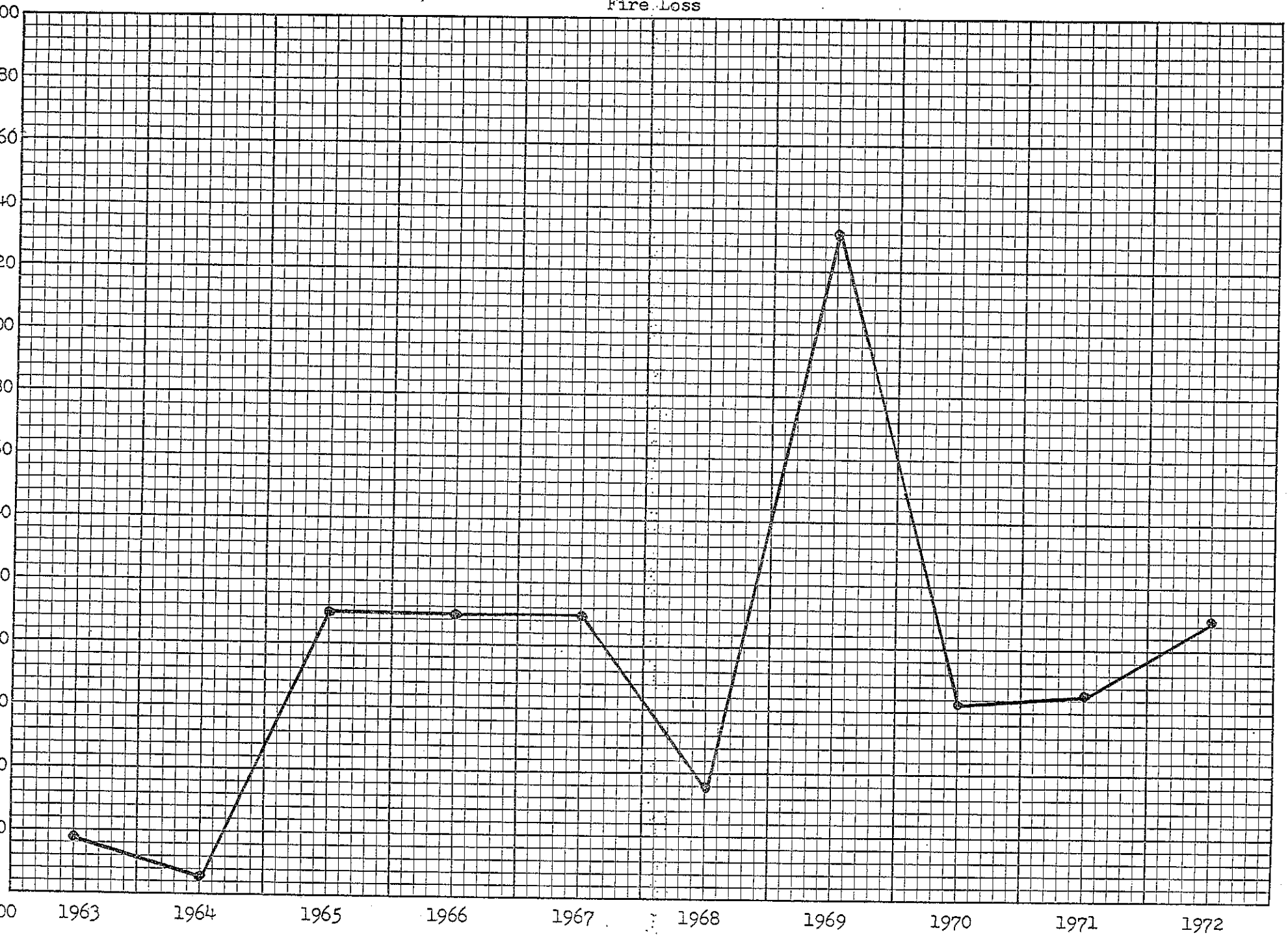


Fire Runs



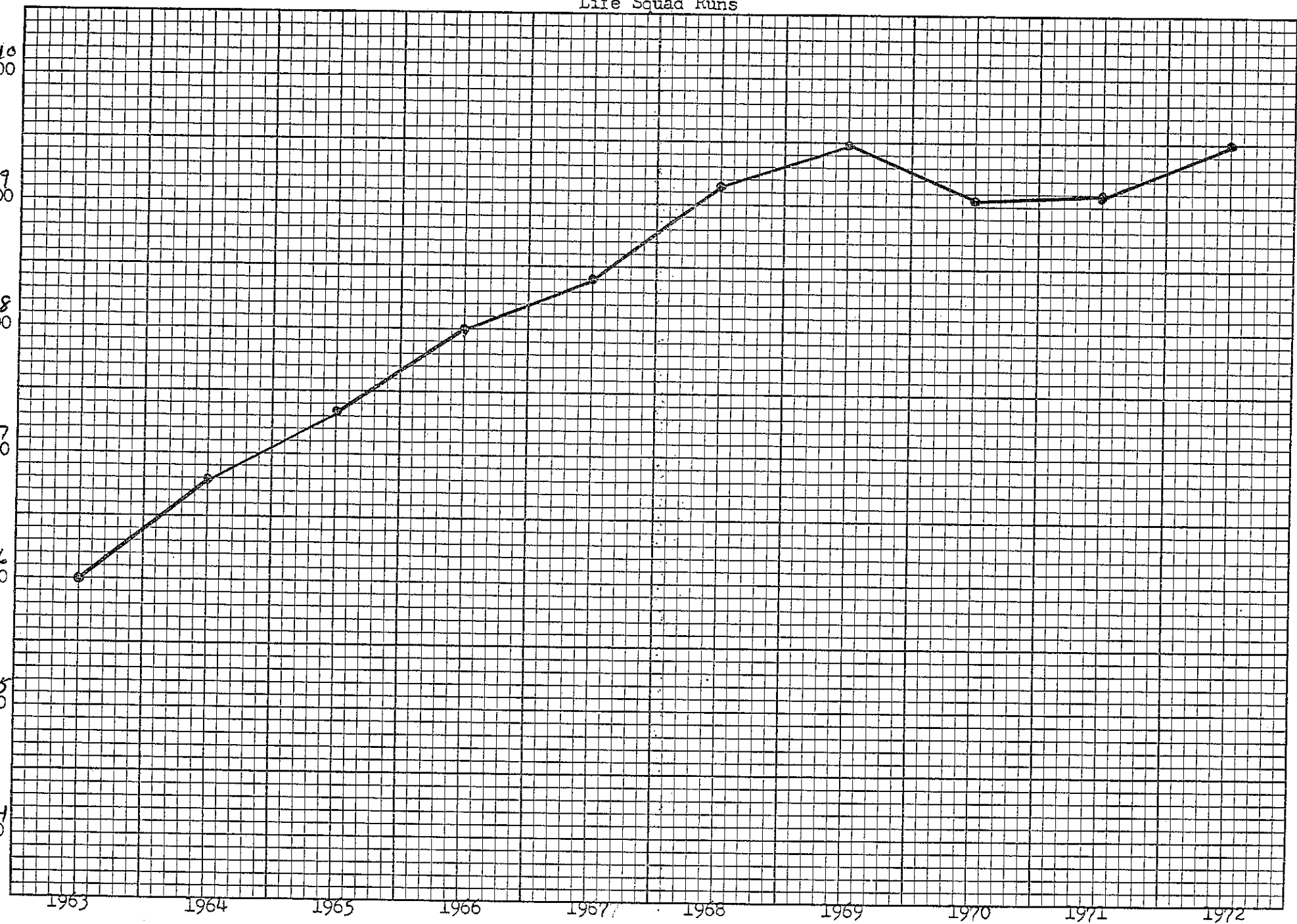


Fire Loss



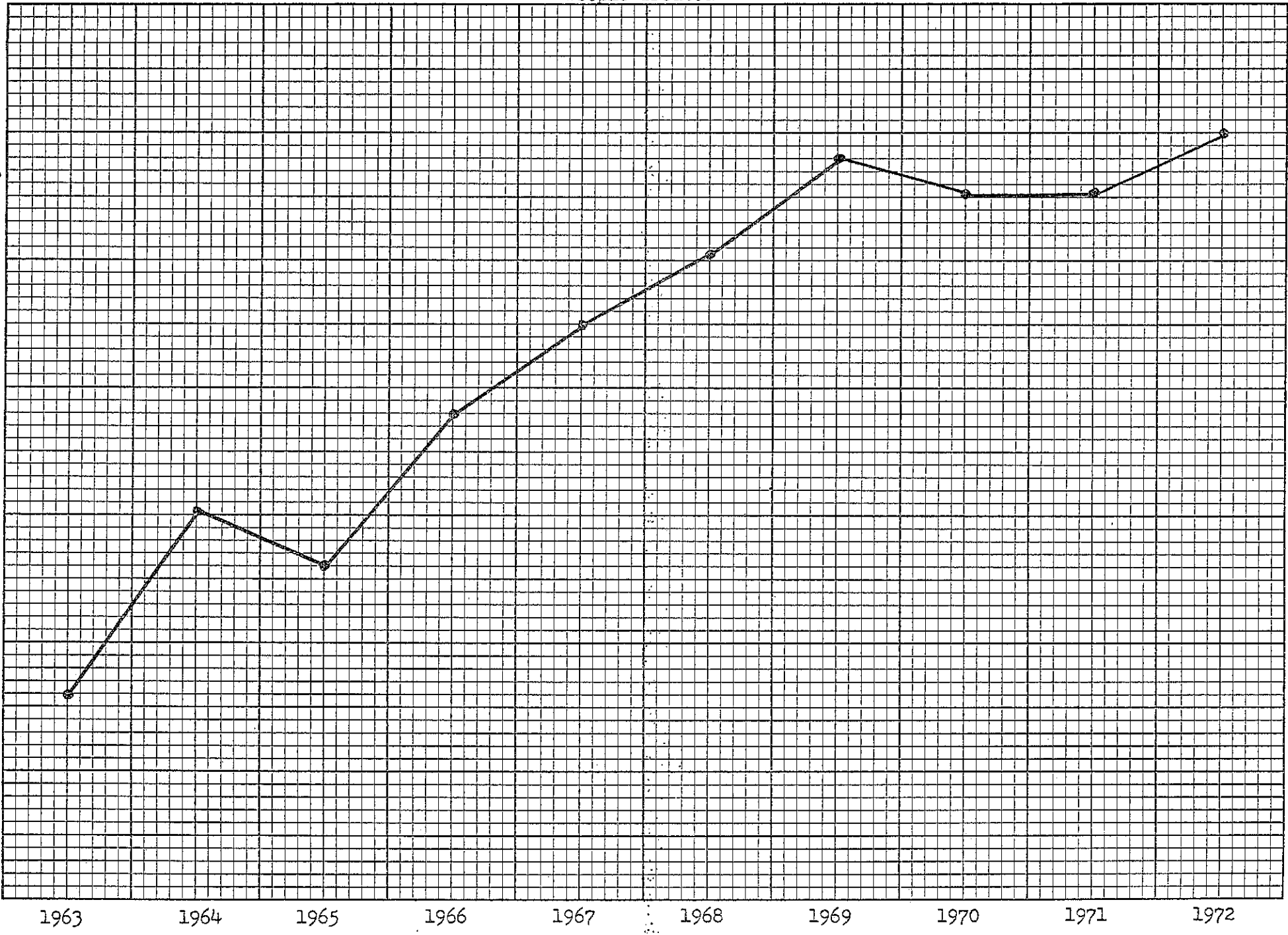


Life Squad Runs
